一、申请时间

学分交换项目于每年 11 月初(申请春季学期交换)、5 月初(申请秋季学期交换) 之前递交申请材料。**暑期学校**于每年 3 月报名,提交申请。**研究生项目**最晚于每年 4 月前 提交申请。

二、申请流程

申请人联系 LJMU 中国中心报名→ 准备申请材料→ 网上填写并提交申请表→ 等待审核和录取通知→支付全款学费及住宿申请→学校发放 CAS (学期项目无此步骤)→ 准备 签证→入学

三、入学要求

学分交换项目的短期交换生: 2017 学年暂不需要雅思成绩,但应具备相应英语能力**本科**: 雅思 6.0 (听说读写各单科不低于 5.5):

注: 若雅思 5.5,则需在我校读 6 周语言课

若雅思 5.0,则需在我校读 12 周语言课

硕士: 雅思 6-6.5; 本科平均成绩 75%

注: 具体学分根据不同课程决定, 听说读写各单科相应不低于 5.5 或 6 分

四、申请材料

- ●个人陈述电子版(英文,包括所要申请学院及专业,教育背景,学术经历,研究内容,所获成就,学习目的,职业理想等内容)。
- ●学术成绩单电子版扫描件(英文)。
- ●英语能力证明(学年交换或攻读学位需要2年内雅思成绩单。学期交换提供2年内雅思成绩单**或**四六级成绩单),电子版扫描件。
- ●护照电子版扫描件。
- ●2 份正式英文推荐信,需老师签名,电子版扫描件。
- ●在读证明(英文),电子版扫描件。
- ●所有艺术类专业需要提供作品集电子版或扫描件,要求不限,需展现自己的艺术思想。





注: 材料准备齐全后,网上申请表填写并提交扫描件,如有疑问可至 LJMU 中国中心现场完成申请。

五、录取及支付学费定金

资料提交后等待学校审核,发放录取通知书后需在网上确认并支付全款学费,学费详情请关注学校官网。

六、签证办理

申请签证的时间必须在开学前的 3 个月之内,超过 3 个月的申请将视为无效申请。签证审查时间一般是 15 个工作日,选择加急服务的则缩短到 3-5 个工作日。学生签证费用为 335 英镑,费用只能在网上在线付款,拒签后费用不退还。

- ●白底签证照片两张(45mmX 35mm,照片背面写上自己的名字)
- ●存款证明(可以是存单,存折或者银行开出的正规存款证明。如果存款是父母名下的需要额外提供申请者的出生证明或亲属公证书。方便起见建议存款存在申请者名下)
- ●肺结核检测报告(自 2013 年 12 月 31 日开始,所有在中国境内包括香港和澳门的申请 赴英期限超过 6 个月的个人均要求接受肺结核检测。考虑到时间问题,建议在签证前 2 个 月做。)

Liberal Arts proposal: semester long

This offering has been drawn together from a number of programmes across the school (and there are sufficient options for it to be run in semester one or two). Apart from the compulsory orientation module, they are all pre-existing, validated modules with appropriate capacity to absorb additional numbers of students. The programme, as a whole, will give students a strong grounding in the Liverpool region, local, global and cultural history, English language and literature and issues relating to contemporary journalism. Assessments are flexible and staff will be on hand to advise students on how to succeed and cope with the demands of the modules.

HISTORY

4102HIST. The Faces of Britain (semester 2)

The Faces of Britain sets out the foundations of British history by questioning how the British nation might be defined and how the British people might seek to establish their place within the nation. As such it





explores the various political, social and cultural factors which create the environment and backdrop to the negotiation of identity.

Assessment: Exam

4104HIST. Modern European History: Myth, Memory and the Uses of the Past (semester 1)

In this module students will explore these questions by examining the different stories which Europeans have told about the past over the previous two centuries. Students will consider the ways in which various political communities have manufactured different versions of the past in order to define their identities and legitimate their goals, as well as how individuals have made use of the past to suit their own ends.

Assessment: Essay

4015HIST. The American Age (semester 2)

In this broad module survey students are led through key developments in America's past, from its foundations, through the divisions caused by slavery to the nation's emergence on the world stage from the early 20th Century onwards. The module also introduces students to debates around American identity and politics, with case studies used to illustrate the diverse opinions and ideas that have informed America's development.

Assessment: Poster project

JOURNALISM

4031JOURN Professional Practice for International Journalists (Year-long/semester 1)

International News Reporting

This is a year-long Level 4 module but the 'International News Reporting' component is open to students as a semester 1 module. The aim of this component is to help students understand the broader context and specific characteristics of international news reporting. It also develops the students' knowledge and understanding of reporting on a global stage.

Assessment: creation of a news article

5036JOURN Contemporary International Relations for Journalists (Semester 1)





This Level 5 module provides students an opportunity to acquire the academic knowledge of International Relations that is relevant to the work of mainstream global news organisations. It also considers how news coverage of global conflict and terrorist events is shaped by a variety of domestic and international factors with particular reference to global terrorism since 'September 11'.

Assessment: Essay

ENGLISH

4100ENGL Reading English (semester 1)

On this module students will read a wide variety of works from different periods and exemplifying the three major genres: poetry, fiction and drama. The module covers a long timescale, from the Renaissance to contemporary literature and introduces you to different ways of reading.

Assessment: Essay

4101ENGL American Classics (semester 1)

American Classics is an introduction to American literature and its wider significance in American culture. We have selected a range of texts (novels and poetry) that are considered 'classics', and will be discussing what this means through a reading of the texts, their contexts and their critical histories.

Assessment: Exam

4105ENGL World, Time and Text (semester 2)

On this module, you will read texts from different periods and of different styles and genres. A primary concern of the module is intertextuality, and you will be encouraged to make connections between quite different texts, to trace themes and concerns across time and space, and to discover and express intertextual relationships through scholarly analysis.

Assessment: Essay

4104ENGL Literature and Context: Britain in the 1950s (semester 2)

This module explores the way literary works both reflect and change the social and cultural contexts that surround them. We'll be working with a wide range of texts written in Britain during the 1950s, and exploring themes such as the post-war fracturing of class boundaries, changing social attitudes to the roles of men and women, immigration and the origins of Britain's multicultural society, and the rise of youth culture.

Assessment: Exam





Media, Culture and Communication

Compulsory orientation module

This module introduces students to exploring a local British environment from a media and cultural studies perspective. Students will examine broadcast and print media. They will investigate the national role of the city through its history, heritage and place in the popular imagination. It looks specifically at the roles of sport, theatre, music, poetry and the nature of being a port city. Students will study different aspects of the city of Liverpool, develop their own project and be encouraged to undertake empirical research.


